Cricket Without Boundaries is a community development and HIV / Aids awareness charity operating in Africa. Since its establishment in 2005 the charity has coached over 4000 children and trained 250 new ICC coaches across Africa with an additional emphasis on raising Aids awareness.

Based on our success since our foundation was established, we are now looking to recruit volunteers to deliver projects in any of these countries: Rwanda/Kenya/Botswana/Uganda.

We are looking for general sports enthusiasts, **qualified or unqualified**, for these projects taking place between October 2008 and early 2009. Each project will require 2 weeks to be spent in Africa and a weekend of training in the UK leading up to departure.

We are specifically looking for Project Leaders, Coaches (all levels), Coach and Umpire Tutors, Photographers and general volunteers (training is available) who are:

- Able to work on own initiative
- Good communicators
- Able to complete an ECB Criminal Records Bureau Enhanced Check
- Able to raise funds to support the project
- Interested in working in Africa

The projects will include working with local schools, delivery of HIV / Aids awareness messages, training local people as coaches, umpires and scorers and acting as a representative of Cricket Without Boundaries within local communities.
